Endangered Species

Topics covered:

Conservation of endangered species in Hong Kong

Background information:

Many kinds of living things in the world are facing different threats as a result of human activities. Their populations are dropping rapidly. This means they may become extinct if we don't protect them now!

Teaching objectives

- 1. To arouse awareness of and concern for the loss of habitats and extinction of species.
- 2. To introduce a local species that is important for conservation internationally.
- 3. To learn about the different endangered species in Hong Kong and their current situation.

Suggested study mode

Classroom activity

Suggested procedures

- Start the lesson by listening to the <u>call of Romer's Tree Frog</u> and ask students to guess what the sound is. Play the <u>video clip of Romer's Tree Frog</u>. Go to <u>Worksheet IS-9</u>, and complete the profile of Romer's Tree Frog. - 2. Introduce the reasons for its endangerment.
- 3. Go on to Worksheet IS-10 and discuss with students the different threats that wild endangered animals face and the ways to protect them.
